- 123:1-19-02 Sets forth the parameters, policies, and protocols associated with probationary periods for employees in the classified civil service.
- 123:1-32-01 Covers the availability, use of, and compensation associated with sick leave, vacation leave, and personal leave for employees paid by warrant of the Director of the Office of Budget and Management.
- 123:1-47-01 Contains the definition of defined terms that are used in OAC Chapters 123:1-1 through 123:1-47.
