PROPOSED RULES

<u>1301:17-1-01</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Public notice

The intent of this regulation is to provide the procedure in giving public notice, as required by law, of the intention to consider adopting, amending or rescinding a rule.

<u>1301:17-1-02</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Open public meeting

The intent of this regulation is to set forth the procedure for providing public notice to a Board meeting.

1301:17-1-03 – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Fees

The purpose of this regulation is to comply with the rule-making requirements found in Ohio Revised Code Section 4764.05(A)(2). The rule establishes the fees associated with an Ohio home inspector license.

<u>1301:17-1-04</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Out of State Applicants

The intent of this regulation is to establish the form and manner by which out of state applicants may apply for an Ohio home inspector license.

<u>1301:17-1-05</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Applications

The intent of this regulation is to establish the form and manner by which applicants may apply for an Ohio home inspector license.

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<u>1301:17-1-06</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Criminal records check

The intent of this regulation is to establish the process of completing a criminal background check by an applicant for an Ohio home inspector license as required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4764.07(B).

1301:17-1-07 – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Home Inspector Qualifying Education

The intent of this regulation is to ensure home inspector applicants are sufficiently educated and competent to complete home inspections.

<u>1301:17-1-10</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Continuing Education for Licensees

The intent of this regulation is to ensure home inspector licensees are regularly completing education offerings that maintain or increase a licensee's skill, knowledge and competency in home inspection.

<u>1301:17-1-11</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Continuing Education Approvals for Education Providers

The intent of this regulation is to ensure education providers, who are offering home inspector continuing education, provide effective offerings that increase a licensee's skill, knowledge and competency.

1301:17-1-13 – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Curriculum of experience

The purpose of this regulation is to comply with the rule-making requirements found in Ohio Revised Code Section 4764.07(D)(6)(a) and establish the requirements for an acceptable curriculum of experience which is designed to ensure applicants are adequately trained and competent to complete home inspections.

1301:17-1-14 – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Parallel inspection

The purpose of this regulation is to comply with the rule-making requirements found in Ohio Revised Code Section 4764.07(D)(6)(b) and establish the requirements for acceptable parallel inspection sessions for applicants which are designed to ensure applicants are adequately trained and competent to complete home inspections.

<u>1301:17-1-15</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Peer review

The purpose of this regulation is to comply with the rule-making requirements found in Ohio Revised Code Section 4764.05(A)(15) and establish the requirements for acceptable peer review sessions for home inspector applicants.

1301:17-1-16 – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Canons of ethics

The intent of this regulation is to establish the canons of ethics to be followed by Ohio home inspector licensees.

<u>1301:17-1-17</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Standards of practice

The intent of this regulation is to establish the standards of practice to be complied with by Ohio home inspector licensees.

<u>1301:17-1-18</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Lending license

The purpose of this regulation is to comply with the rule-making requirements found in Ohio Revised Code Section 4764.05(A)(1) and prevent the mis-use of an Ohio home inspector license.

<u>1301:17-1-19</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Stenographic record

The intent of this regulation is to establish the Division shall provide a record of the hearings conducted within the Division's regulating authority, and the procedure in which the record is produced and made available to interested parties.

1301:17-1-20 – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Informal mediation

The intent of this regulation is to establish the procedure associated with an informal mediation affecting Ohio home inspector licensees.

<u>1301:17-1-21</u> – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Disciplinary sanctions

The purpose of this regulation is to comply with the rule-making requirements found in Ohio Revised Code Section 4764.05(A)(1) and to establish the standards governing sanctions that may be issued by the Ohio Home Inspector Board upon an Ohio home inspector licensee.

1301:17-1-22 – Division staff recommends this rule be adopted.

Settlement agreement

The intent of this regulation is to establish the requirements for settlement agreements entered into by the Superintendent and an Ohio home inspector licensee that has been charged with violating license law.
