Pursuant to section 4141.13 and Chapter 119 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) gives notice that it proposes to amend rule 4141-11-01, entitled "Quarterly reports and due date", and that a public hearing on this proposal will take place at the date, time, and place listed above, accessible simultaneously via the listed web site and phone number.

This rule sets forth requirements for employers to periodically report the wages and hours of people who work for them, as is necessary for State administration of the Unemployment Compensation (UC) system. ODJFS proposes to amend the rule in order to enhance data gathering in alignment with the reporting methods of most other states. The intended changes to the rule include the following:

- o Addition of a paragraph to require a rotating sample of employers to answer the national Occupational Employment and Wage Survey. The existing rule only mandates filing of the quarterly wage and hour report.
- o Addition of a paragraph that describes general expectations for the schedule and filing method of the OEWS survey.
