Owing to the rescission of current rule 113-40-04, TOS proposes renumbering current rule 113-40-07 as 113-40-06 so that the Chapter may remain in a sequential order. TOS proposes several minor, non-substantive changes to paragraphs (A)(1), (A)(2), (B), (C), and (D) to improve readability. TOS proposes modification of paragraphs (A)(1) (a) through (f). The proposed modifications outline a new fee schedule which more accurately reflects the programmatic expenses related to the administration of Ohio Pooled Collateral Program, including required upgrades to the underlying technology supporting the Ohio Pooled Collateral System and the additional costs associated with evaluating banks for reduced collateral. A table outlining these fees has also been proposed for quick reference and easy readability. Finally, paragraph (A)(2) has been modified to increase the fee for participation in the program. The fee is invoiced annually and will be pro-rated for partial year participation. Please note, all pooled collateral program banks would be subject to the financial institution fee and specific pledge account (if applicable), the Reduced Collateral Fee would only be applied to banks who have been approved for reduced collateral.
