Dental and vision coverage have been moved to new Rule 145-4-60. In paragraph (B), the deletion of the second sentence removes an eligibility exception for joint and survivor beneficiaries who are not surviving spouses or dependent children. This grandfathered eligibility closed in late 2006. Since spouses will be transitioning to no allowance by 2018, it was necessary to address the eligibility of this covered group. The coverage will terminate effective January 1, 2015. Staff will communicate directly with the impacted population and COBRA is available.
