This rule is being amended for the 2018 plan year to reflect improved application processing times and to limit the amount of time a new retiree may delay enrollment outside of the annual open enrollment period.

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Several updates are made in this rule and Rules 145-4-30 and 145-4-38 to reflect faster processing times for enrollment and disenrollment in health care coverage. The amendments also shorten the 60-day window at retirement to apply for health care coverage to 30 days after the initial benefit payment. Retirees can still enroll (and add dependents) during annual open enrollment and within 60 days of an involuntary termination of coverage.
