- 3. Use "reporting activities" in paragraph (A)(5) of this rule to replace "documentation of activities" in the same paragraph and "reporting" in paragraph (A)(6)(c) of this rule.
- 4. Delete "complaint investigation and resolution" in paragraph (A)(6)(e) of this rule because it duplicates "complaint handling" in paragraph (A)(3)(c) of this rule.
- 5. Separate the topics for ombudsman specialists and ombudsman program directors so that all requirements for ombudsman specialists appear under paragraph (B) of this rule and all requirements for ombudsman program directors appear under paragraph (C) of this rule.
