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This rule exists to comply with R.C. §173.392 and 45 C.F.R. 1321.11. The primary purpose of this filing is to reduce regulatory restrictions.

This rule establishes requirements applying only to agreements for the homemaker service. ODA proposes

to amend this rule to achieve the following:

- 1. Delete unnecessary regulatory restrictions.
- 2. Indicate that routine transportation activities include picking up groceries, but not grocery shopping assistance which is a service that ODA defines in rule 173-4-10 of the Administrative Code.
- 3. Exempt the requirement for collecting the unique identifier of the consumer's caregiver (in lieu of the consumer) during a state of emergency declared by the governor or a federal public health emergency.

ODA made a revised filing of this rule to highlight that House Bill 100 (134th G.A.) enacted Chapter 3740. of the Revised Code, which requires homemaker providers to have a home health license. Adding a helpful reference to this new requirement in this rule will not increase the regulatory burden already created by House Bill 100 and Chapter 3740. of the Revised Code. Additionally, the helpful reference will not add any regulatory restriction words to this rule.
