This rule establishes the requirements to become, and to remain, an ODA-certified provider of the choices home care attendant service.

ODA proposes to amend this rule to achieve the following:

- 1. Replace words that imply requirements for outdated modes of communication or in-person interaction (e.g., "submit") with other words (e.g., "provide") or add "or electronic" after "written" to achieve the same effect.
- 2. Explain that the rule's requirements to complete time sheets (vs., task sheets) apply only until rule 5160-1-40 of the Administrative Code requires the provider to use EVV to verify the provision of a service.
- 3. Require providers and individuals to prove their unique identifier to verify the accuracy of the task sheet.

ODA also proposes to make non-substantive amendments to this rule.
