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ODA and the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman (SLTCO) propose to amend this rule as part of project to transfer ombudsman-related language from OAC Chapter 173-9 to OAC173-14-14.

This rule requires responsible parties to check criminal records to determine if an applicant or employee is disqualified for a direct-care position by their records.

ODA and SLTCO propose to transfer all ombudsman language to OAC173-14-14.

ODA also proposes the following non-substantive updates to the remaining language:

- \* Adding "Background checks: paid direct-care positions" to the beginning of the rule's title to help the general public more easily find the rule when using internet search engines.
- \* Replacing the mistaken use of "(re-hire)" in (A) with "(pre-hire)."
- \* Using the term "individual" for ODA-administered programs requiring ODA certification and continuing to use "consumer" for ODA-administered programs not requiring ODA certification.
- \* Replacing some occurrences of "obtain" and its variants with "receive" and its variants.
- \* Adding an informative paragraph, (C), that says ORC§109.572(B)(1) requires BCII to open sealed records.
- \* Replacing "fingerprint impressions" with "fingerprints."
- \* Deleting "the" in the occurrence of "the the."
