Transfer/Withdrawal/Ineligibility for Scholarship.

- (A) If a parent of a child, who is participating in the autism scholarship program, determines that they want to transfer from one provider to another, during the course of a given school year, the parent must follow the guidelines for transferring children as established by the department of education.
- (B) Circumstances may arise that cause a child to withdraw from the program. Administration of withdrawal from the program is established by guidelines as established by the department of education.
- (C) If a parent or provider informs the district of residence, in writing, that the child is withdrawing from the autism scholarship program prior to the end of a given school year and the parent has not requested a transfer to a new provider, per established department of education guidelines, then the child's scholarship becomes null and void. If a scholarship becomes null and void, the parents, as well as the school district of residence, will be notified, in writing, by the department of education. Such notice must include information outlining whether the child is eligible to be reinstated into the program.
- (D) If a parent withdraws their child from the program or the child becomes ineligible to participate in the program, the parent will immediately notify the school district of residence, in writing, that the child will be returning to the district of residence. This notice will include the date the child will be returning to the district.
