The Ohio Department of Health is seeking amendment of this rule to ensure

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consistency with recent revisions to the Ohio Revised Code, and to change several definitions used throughout Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 3701-12.

This rule provides definitions of numerous terms used throughout Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 3701-12, such as "affected person," "certificate of need," "commencement of construction" and "existing healthcare facility." The rule is amended to change the definition of "existing healthcare facility" and add a definition for "commencement of construction." The rule is further amended to correct several cross-citations.
