**Diseases to be reported.****RULE SUMMARY**

6. State the reason(s) for proposing (i.e., why are you filing,) this rule:

Due to confusion regarding the current reporting classification where disease reporters often do not know which diseases are Class B(1) diseases and Class B(2) diseases, the Director is proposing to consolidate Class B(1) and Class B(2) diseases into one reporting category with the same reporting timeframe. In addition, to be consistent with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) list of Nationally Notifiable Infectious Conditions, the Director is proposing to add one disease to Ohio's reportable disease list and to remove or rename several other diseases.

This rule provides the list of reportable infectious diseases that are declared to be dangerous to public health. By amending this rule, the Director is proposing to consolidate Class B(1) and Class B(2) diseases into one reporting category; and to add, remove, and rename diseases on the list of reportable diseases to be consistent with CDC's list of "Nationally Notifiable Infectious Conditions."
