This rule is proposed to satisfy five-year review requirements and to require reporting of carbapenemase producing carbapenem-resistant Enterobacteriacea (CP-CRE): Enterobacter species, Escherichia coli, Klebsiella species. Carbapenemase-producing carbapenem-resistant Enterobacteriaceae (CP-CRE). These diseases are an emerging public health problem and will be nationally notifiable in January 2018.

7. Summarize the rule's content, and if this is an amended rule, also summarize the rule's changes.

The rule lists those reportable diseases that physicians, laboratories, hospitals, and other healthcare providers must report to public health. The proposal specifically adds a disease that is reportable (carbapenemase producing carbapenem-resistant Enterobacteriacea) and subcategorizes an already reportable disease, hepatitis C, into hepatitis C (non-perinatal) and hepatitis C (perinatal).
