This rule has been reviewed to satisfy five-year review requirements and to align with national standards for rabies prevention and control.

The amended rule lists when biting animals need to be confined and when a veterinarian needs to report to public health and specifically updates paragraphs (C) (1)(b) and (C)(2). The proposed amendments clarify the quarantine period for a known

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rabid biting dog, cat, or ferret (quarantine period is reduced from six to four months for dogs and cats and maintained at six months for ferrets) in paragraph (C)(1)(b), and provides updated booster vaccination guidance (period from exposure to a biting animal and vaccination of the animal should not exceed 96 hours) in paragraph (C)(2).
