Prescribes that prior to collecting blood specimens for screening, the person designated in 3701-45-05 shall give each newborn child's parent, legal guardian, or legal custodian, notice of the screening to be conducted by providing printed information (provided by the Director of Health) describing the newborn, genetic, endocrine and metabolic screening program.
