Sets forth procedures for making a finding against an accused. An individual with a finding will be listed on the Nurse Aide Registry with that finding and cannot work in a long term care facility, except that after 1 year, they may petition the Director to remove a finding of neglect.

C. Does this rule require specific expenditures or the report of information as a condition of compliance? No

Collectively, the Chapter 3701-64 rule require notification to the Department of allegation of abuse, neglect or misappropriation by an individual associated with the facility and for the reporting facility to maintain records related to its investigation, including audio/visual records.

The director's findings shall be based upon the hearing officer's recommendation, any written objections and responses, and the hearing record. If the accused failed to request a hearing within the time allowed by paragraph (A) of rule 3701-64-03 of the Administrative Code, the director may make a finding after the expiration of the thirty-day period.
