Ohio Revised Code Section 3717.05 requires the Director of Agriculture and the Public Health Council to base the Ohio Uniform Food Safety Code, which is the statewide standard for food safety in food service operations and retail food establishments, on the most current version of the FDA Model Food Code. These amendments are to ensure that the Ohio Uniform Safety Code continues to conform with the FDA Model Food Code.

Content of this rule is destruction of organisms of public health concern in food. Language changes have been made to conform to the current FDA Model Food Code. Hot holding temperature has been reduced to 135 degrees Fahrenheit from 140 degrees Fahrenheit. References to Ohio Revised and Administrative Codes have been added.
