Section 3717.05 of the Ohio Revised Code requires the director of agriculture and the director of health to adopt, amend, or rescind provisions in the Ohio uniform food safety code to ensure that it continues to conform to the federal food and drug administration#s model food code. The changes proposed are the result of the most recent changes to the federal code, and they fulfill five-year review requirements.

then summarize the content of the rule:

This rule sets forth requirements for licensed food service operations and retail food establishments to limit the growth of organisms in the food that they serve. Changes include: new language on handling ROP fish; clarifying language on date marking; exemption of raw, live in-shell molluscan shellfish from date marking; amended language to clarify that the exemption from date marking for shelf stable dry fermented sausages produced in USDA-regulated facilities is not dependent on the product retaining the original casing; amended language to match the FDA food code by removing the reference to "Keep Refrigerated"; amended language to make clear that only TCS foods prepared under ROP methods that do not control for growth of and toxin formation by Clostridium botulinum and the growth of Listeria monocytogenes require a variance; removal of the requirement for a variance when harvesting seed or bean sprouts; exempting certain facilities from having to have a HACCP plan; added new language that provides information needed in a HACCP plan; spelling correction of degrees; increasing the shelf life for ROP food; clarified no bare hand contact of ready to eat food; added new language to specify that a HACCP plan shall be provided to the regulatory authority prior to implementation; extended the time in which foods packaged using a cook-chill or sous vide process may be held; and added new language that identifies the contents of a HACCP plan.
