This rule is being proposed due to the required five year review as well as updating the rules to be consistent to the current version of the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) Model Food Code. Section 3717.05 (B)(1) of the Revised Code requires the Ohio uniform food safety code to be based on the most current version of the FDA model food code.

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This rule provides standards for materials that may be used for construction and repair of equipment and utensils in a food service operation or retail food establishment. Proposed changes include: (G)(1) reword floating paragraph and made it (G)(1); (G)(2) remove "that" between "wood" and "may"; (G)(2)(a) remove "and" at the end of the paragraph; (G)(2)(b) remove period and add "; and" at the end of the paragraph; (G)(2) (c) add new section "Wood fermentation tanks, wood maturation barrels, and other wood used in the alcoholic beverage making process"; (G)(3) add "Whole"; remove "Wood shipping containers in which whole"; add "may be kept in the wood shipping containers in which they were"; remove "are" before "received"; add ",until" after "received"; removed "if" in front of the fruits; and remove "kept in them until"; (G)(4) remove "Untreated wood containers or wood containers treated with a preservative that meets the requirements specified in 21 C.F.R. 178.3800, and"; add "If the nature of" to the beginning of the paragraph; remove "that is stored in them is whole, uncut, raw food that"; added ", the whole, uncut, raw food may be kept in:" at the end of the paragraph; and delete the "." at the end of the paragraph; (G)(4)(a) add new section "Untreated wood containers; or"; and (G)(4)(b) add new section "Treated wood containers if the containers are treated with a preservative that meets the requirements specified in 21 C.F. R. 178.3800."
