To establish minimum standards and reserves and nonforfeiture values for preneed life insurance contracts based on the study that determined the 2001 CSO was inappropriate for determining reserves for policies used to fund funeral services and expenses.

The rule establishes for preneed insurance products minimum mortality standards for reserves and nonforfeiture values, and to require the use of the 1980 Commissioners Standard Ordinary (CSO) Life Valuation Mortality Table for use in determining the minimum standard of valuation of reserves and the minimum standard nonforfeiture values for preneed insurance products. Ins 3509.02 Applicability and Scope. This section applies to preneed insurance contracts, as defined in Ins 3509.03, and to similar policies and certificates.
