4167-6-10 Reporting fatalities, hospitalization, amputations, and loss of an eye as a result of work-related incidents.

- (A) Within eight hours after the death of any <u>public</u> employee from a work-related incident, the <u>public</u> employer of any affected <u>public</u> employees shall orally report the incident to the superintendent at the phone number indicated on the poster required under rule 4167-4-01 of the Administrative Code <u>or by electronic submission using the appropriate form located on the bureau of workers' compensation website.</u>
- (B) The <u>public</u> employer shall report any of the following within twenty-four hours of a work-related incident to the superintendent at the phone number indicated on the poster required under rule 4167-4-01 of the Administrative Code or by electronic submission using the appropriate form located on the public employer risk reduction program website:
 - (1) The hospitalization of one or more <u>public</u> employees;
 - (2) An A public employee's amputation; or
 - (3) An A public employee's loss of an eye.
- (C) If the <u>public</u> employer does not learn of a reportable incident at the time it occurs, the <u>public</u> employer shall make an initial report within eight hours of the time the incident is reported to any <u>employer or agent manager</u>, <u>supervisor</u>, <u>or legal representative</u> of the <u>public</u> employer.
- (D) Each initial report required by this section <u>rule</u> shall <u>relate provide</u> the following information: <u>establishment name</u>, <u>location of the incident</u>, <u>time of the incident</u>, <u>number of fatalities</u>, <u>hospitalized employees</u>, <u>or injured employees</u>, <u>contact person for the employer</u>, <u>phone number</u>, and a brief description of the incident.
 - (1) Establishment name,
 - (2) Location of the incident,
 - (3) Time of the incident,
 - (4) Number of fatalities, hospitalizations, and injuries involving public employees,
 - (5) Contact person and phone number for the public employer, and
 - (6) A brief description of the incident.

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(E) The superintendent shall will develop and implement policies and procedures to conduct inspections and investigations of reported incidents pursuant to rule 4167-8-01 of the Administrative Code.
