This filing is based on a R.C. 119.032 rule review of Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 4501-1. Due to LSC rule drafting requirements applicable when 50% of a rule is being changed, the existing rule is being filed for proposed rescission and this proposed new rule (same title and number) is being filed to replace it. This proposed new version of the rule is to provide updates and clarity including reference to related statutory (R.C. 3327.10 which was recently updated) and Administrative Code provisions.

This rule sets forth driver qualifications. Proposed changes clarify director discretion by replacing "shall" with "may" regarding revocation of a license held by any person who employs a driver who is not physically, mentally, or otherwise qualified and licensed as required by the Revised Code and all rules and regulations "related to school bus drivers" (proposed new language) adopted by the Ohio department of education and the department of public safety. It also newly clarifies that the director may suspend or take other appropriate action on any license for employing a driver who is not physically, mentally, or otherwise qualified and licensed as required by the Revised Code and all rules and regulations related to school bus drivers adopted by the Ohio department of education and the department of public safety. Proposed new language provides that the Revised Code and referenced rules and regulations include, but are not limited to, the requirements of section 3327.10 of the Revised Code and the minimum qualifications for school bus drivers listed in rule 3301-83-06 of the Administrative Code. It also provides that a licensee may not employ a driver convicted of any offense listed in rule 3301-20-01 of the Administrative Code.
