This rule is being filed according to a scheduled five-year R.C. 119.032 rule review. This rule is also proposed to replace current 4501-5-01 due to the Legislative Service Commission's rule-formatting guidelines, as it is estimated that more than fifty percent of the rule's content has been revised.

This rule sets forth the general provisions regarding the purpose of, and compliance with, Chapter 4501-5 of the Administrative Code. This rule provides definitions for terms used in Chapter 4501-5; requirements for notice of compliance, changes to equipment, and equipment recalls to be submitted to the director of public safety; documentation to be provided to purchasers of school buses; and materials incorporated by reference. Changes to this new rule organize incorporated materials and more clearly address the materials' availability in compliance with sections 121.71 to 121.74 of the Revised Code.

This rule addresses availability of materials incorporated by reference in Chapter 4501-5 of the Administrative Code in compliance with 121.71 to 121.74 of the Revised Code.

Paragraphs (P)(2)(a) to (P)(2)(f) incorporate seven dated versions of Ohio school bus construction standards, all of which are being filed with this rule, and all of which will be deposited with the state library for distribution to Ohio's five depository libraries upon adoption of this rule. The standards may also be obtained by writing to the State Highway Patrol's Licensing and Commercial Standards section in Columbus, Ohio or accessed via its website.

This rule also includes Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards and Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, which are published in the Code of Federal Regulations. In accordance with section 121.75 of the Revised Code, sections 121.71 to 121.74 of the Revised Code does not apply to the Code of Federal Regulations, if the standards are cited sufficiently and an explanation of general accessibility is provided. This rule provides a physical address and a website address where these materials may be obtained or accessed.

The Ohio school bus construction standards are being filed as part of this rule.

This rule requires school buses to meet, and be maintained in compliance with, the standards set forth in Chapter 4501-5. As these standards are provided in rules 4501-5-02 and 4501-5-03, the estimated costs of compliance are provided in their RSFAs.

- A.) Does this rule require a license, permit, or any other prior authorization to engage in or operate a line of business? Yes

This rule requires manufacturers, dealers, and owners, who wish to install equipment on school buses other than that which is specified in Chapter 4501-5 of the Administrative Code, to obtain approval from the director of public safety in writing prior to its use and operation.

Section 4511.761 of the Revised Code provides that all school buses shall pass inspection and display current inspection decals prior to being authorized for use to transport students.

B.) Does this rule impose a criminal penalty, a civil penalty, or another sanction, or create a cause of action, for failure to comply with its terms? Yes

This rule provides that a manufacturer's and/or dealer's failure to comply with Chapter 4501-5 of the Administrative Code may result in the suspension of authorization for the sale and/or use of the school bus chassis and/or body in the state of Ohio until the violation is corrected.

Paragraph (C) of section 4511.76 of the Revised Code provides that whoever violates Chapter 4501-5 of the Administrative Code is guilty of a minor misdemeanor, while subsequent violations are misdemeanors of the fourth degree.

C.) Does this rule require specific expenditures or the report of information as a condition of compliance? Yes

This rule sets forth the requirement for school bus manufacturers to file a statement of compliance with the director of public safety that all products and components manufactured for use in Ohio school buses comply with division (F) of section 4511.01 of the Revised Code and Chapter 4501-5 of the Administrative Code, provide purchasers with written documentation specifying warranty provisions and a documented delivery list, and request permission to use/install any equipment or product, other than those specified in Chapter 4501-5 of the Administrative Code, in writing.

Further, this rule requires school buses to meet, and be maintained in compliance with, the standards set forth in Chapter 4501-5. As these standards are provided in rules 4501-5-02 and 4501-5-03, the estimated costs of compliance are provided in their RSFAs.
