Rule is filed in compliance with R.C. 119.032 rule review requirements. Proposed changes are to update, clarify, and restructure language to keep pertinent provisions together.

The rule provides standards and specifications regarding type B, C, and D school bus chassis. Amendments update language to current national school transportation specifications and procedures, clarify and/or eliminate ambiguous language, and restructure language to keep pertinent information together.

To remain current and in compliance with all federal and the applicable safety and equipment requirements and guidelines, school bus manufacturers and owners (the persons who reasonably can be expected to be affected by the rules of OAC Chapter 4501-5) already stay abreast of the industry standards incorporated by reference in OAC Chapter 4501-5 (industry standards include those of the Society of Automotive Engineers, the American Society for Testing and Materials and the National School Transportation Specification and Procedures). Additionally, in Rule 4501-5-01 we have provided the address, telephone number, and when applicable, web site information for these organizations.

While Rule 4501-5-02 also incorporates federal regulations and R.C. Section 121.75 provides that the provisions of R.C. 121.71 to 121.74 do not apply with regard to the incorporation by reference of federal rules and laws, in Rule 4501-5-01 we have additionally provided address and web site information for the cited federal rules.

As provided in Rule 4501-5-01, the rules of OAC Chapter 4501-5 incorporate earlier versions of Ohio school bus minimum construction standards in effect on the bid date, or if bid date is unknown, on the manufacture date of older buses. (A complete and accurate copy of the standards is being filed with JCARR.) These standards are currently available in printed form and most Ohio schools and bus manufacturers already have copies of these standards. The standards are lengthy and would require a large expenditure of time to reproduce electronically. The standards will be deposited in five depository libraries when those libraries have been designated by the State Library Board under R.C. 3375.01. In the meantime, these standards are available via the State Highway Patrol Licensing and Commercial Standards Section, 1970 West Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43223.
