The rule is being revised filed to add new paragraph (CC) phasing in mandatory electronic stability control for school buses over the next couple years. This was requested by the representative from the Ohio School Board Association, and was discussed with all stakeholders on November 7, 2018 to make sure there was no opposition. Additionally, the CSI office was updated on November 13, 2018 and had not additional comment.

Two of the three manufacturers in Ohio already have electronic stability control as standard, while the third was supportive of the phased in requirement. The requirement would not change the estimated cost of compliance with the rule originally stated in the BIA and RSFA.
