This filing is based on a R.C. 119.032, five-year rule review of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 4501:2-9. The rules of Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 4501:2-9 are being proposed for rescission and simultaneously they are being proposed for adoption to renumber them under Chapter 4501-54 of the Administrative Code. This proposal reflects a legislative change which substituted "department of public safety" for "state highway patrol" in the statute that authorizes the rules. Related rule numbering and language changes are also being proposed throughout the rules of Chapter 4501-54 of the Administrative Code.

This rule provides the requirements for examination administered by the director of a course taken by insureds 60 or over seeking premium reduction under section 3937.43 of the Revised Code. With this filing, the rule number has changed from the existing rule number 4501:2-9-06 to 4501-54-06 and within the text of the rule, correspondingly, rule number references to rules in the chapter have been updated.
