This rule is filed based upon a five-year R.C. 119.032 rule review prompted by legislation which transfers jurisdiction over driver education courses in high schools from the Department of Education to the Department of Public Safety. The purpose of this proposed rule is to update rule language to reflect this recent legislative change, effective January 1, 2004.

The rule defines terms as used in OAC Chapter 4501-7. Amended language expands the definition of "driver training school" to include a board of education of a city, exempted village, local, or joint vocational school district or the governing board of an educational service center that offers a driver education course for high school students enrolled in the district or in a district served by the educational service center.

This is the rule which adds language to change the definition of driver training school to reflect driver training enterprises that are being transferred into the jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety from the Department of Education. These rules will have a negligible impact upon the agency budget. The costs to the agency are those costs associated with designing and printing updated driver training rules (printing of 3000 booklets at \$4-\$5 per booklet). Staff time required to provide support and technical assistance to the public schools being brought into Department of Public Safety jurisdiction, to process the additional school and instructor applications, to conduct more school inspections, and to conduct a review of the existing driver training rules and make any needed changes, all involves existing personnel.

This is the rule which adds language to change the definition of driver training school to reflect driver training enterprises that are being transferred into the

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jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety from the Department of Education. This response for Rule 4501-7-01 addresses the minimum cost to these public schools. Throughout 2003 we have been communicating with these schools (This includes three meetings in March with most of the public schools that are currently offering driver education participating.). Based on the information the public schools have provided, only negligible fiscal effects will be associated with this transition and any related changes will be handled by existing school personnel. We do not anticipate that the transfer in jurisdiction will prove difficult for these schools. Information on the specific fiscal impact of a particular rule is included in the response to question #15 for each rule within the Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 4501-7 proposed amended and "No Change" rule filing packages. Public schools that provide driver training courses subject to the change in jurisdiction will likely experience the following minimum costs: cost of application fees for schools and instructors as set forth in Rules 4501-7-04 and 05 (annual school license renewal fee of \$50 per school location and annual instructor license renewal fee of \$10 per instructor), cost of providing motor vehicle signage that complies with Rule 4501-7-14 (estimated at \$200-\$250 per vehicle), and costs (variable by school, existing personnel) for preparing new documentation (format change) for record keeping purposes. For some schools there will be a range of other potential costs and these include cost of disability training as set forth in Rules 4501-7-05 and 06, if needed, training costs of a training manager as set forth in Rules 4501-7-04 and -05 (if such a person does not already qualify), and costs associated with an administrative action addressed in Rule 4501-7-21 if there is a proposed violation of rules, etc.
