The rule filing is based upon a five-year R.C. 119.032 rule review prompted by legislation which transfers jurisdiction over driver education courses in high schools from the Department of Education to the Department of Public Safety. As a result of the review, it was determined that the rule did not require changes with regard to the change in jurisdiction.

The rule provides requirements for original application and renewal of driver training school licenses.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

13. Estimate the total amount by which *this proposed rule* would **increase/decrease** either **revenues/ expenditures** for the agency during the current biennium (in dollars): Explain the net impact of the proposed changes to the budget of your agency/department.

This will increase revenues.

\$5,000.00 (maximum initial amount)

The estimated \$5,000 maximum initial revenue increase is based on a \$50 license renewal fee for up to 100 public schools that could be transferring from Department of Education to Department of Public Safety jurisdiction. This increase is not expected to have a significant impact on the agency budget.

While the change in jurisdiction from the Department of Education to the Ohio Department of Public Safety involves costs, implementing this rule is not expected to impact the agency budget beyond the cost stated in Rule 4501-7-01 (This is the cost associated with printing updated driver training rules). Any changes related to the jurisdiction transfer that require staff time will be accomplished by existing personnel and we therefore do not expect this rule to have a significant impact on the agency budget.

15. Provide a summary of the estimated cost of compliance with the rule to all directly affected persons. When appropriate, please include the source for your information/estimated costs, e.g. industry, CFR, internal/agency:

This unchanged rule requires no new expenditures by existing schools that are already under Department of Public Safety jurisdiction. The annual license renewal fee of \$50 per school location for an enterprise license is a new expense for a public school. Also the requirement that schools must designate a training manager is new for public schools. If that person does not possess an Ohio Department of Education driver education certificate the person must attend a designated training manager course at a total estimated cost of \$1700 (course fee=\$450, travel

expenses to attend training are estimated at \$450 and salary during training is estimated at \$800 to reflect 40 hours @ \$20 per hour.
