This rule is being proposed for adoption, and simultaneously being proposed for rescission under this same rule number, due to LSC formatting guidelines. It is estimated that changes to the rule strike approximately half of the existing text while adding a comparable amount of new text. The new language in this rule is proposed to implement the Department's on-line driver training pilot program.

This rule sets forth the training requirements and restrictions for all schools including those not participating in the on-line program, as well as those schools who will be providing only on-line education.
