This rule is being filed according to a R.C. 119.032 review.

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This rule sets forth the requirements for equipment, markings and inspections for the commercial motor vehicles used for training. The rule is proposed for amendment to exclude school buses that meet specific regulations from having the instructor brake in paragraph (D) and "student driver" signage in paragraph (F). According to law, these items may not be included on the school buses.

The rule is being amended to include specific inspection requirements for those buses being used as training vehicles in paragraphs (H)(3) and (H)(4). Paragraph (I) is being proposed for the school to maintain a form for tracking of the vehicle inspections.
