This rule sets forth the options for an adult student to take classroom or online training and either behind-the-wheel training with a licensed school or drive with a licensed driver for at least 24 hours. The rule requires each student to receive four hours of classroom or online training. The rule sets forth the requirements for breaks, training environments, final examinations, security measures, and topics of instruction.
