This rule is being filed to implement statutory changes set forth in HB 53, 131st General Assembly.

This rule sets forth the ability of the Director of Public Safety to take action against an applicant or license of an abbreviated adult training course, adult training coordinator, or instructor when the director has determined that provisions of Chapter 4501-8 of the OAC have been violated. The rule also addresses the licensee's rights under Chapter 119. of the Revised Code. Additionally, this proposed rule addresses immediate suspensions of school or instructor licenses for egregious violations as established in Section 4508.06 of the Revised Code

Immediate suspensions may be imposed or administrative actions may be taken which may impose sanctions up to and including suspension and revocation of a license if licensees fail to meet the requirements set forth in this rule.
