New language in this rule is to provide for BMV acceptance of a current, valid DYS identification card issued by the Ohio Department of Youth Services or an Ohio driver's license, Ohio commercial driver's license, or Ohio indentification card as acceptable stand-alone documents for identification of a person applying for an Ohio driver's license, commercial driver's license, temporary permit, or identification card and to provide clarification regarding acceptable secondary

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documents.

This rule provides the acceptable identification to be submitted along with an application for an Ohio driver's license, commercial driver's license, temporary permit, or identification card. Language in proposed new paragraph (D) provides for acceptance of a current, valid DYS identification card issued by the Ohio Department of Youth Services containing the person's photograph, name, date of birth, and social security number as constituting acceptable evidence of the person's identity for the issuance of an Ohio temporary permit, driver's license, commercial driver's license, or Ohio identification card. New language in paragraph (E) also provides for the acceptance of previously issued Ohio driver's licenses, commercial driver's licenses, and Ohio identification cards. In paragraph (B), regarding acceptable secondary documentation, there is proposed deletion of the word "treatment" which changes a reference from "medical treatment records" to "medical records" and proposed addition of the language "within the past three years" which limits internal revenue service or state tax forms as secondary documentation to those issued by the appropriate governmental agency within the past three years.
