This rule governs acceptable identification documents to be submitted along with an application for an Ohio temporary instruction permit identification card, driver's license, commercial driver's license, motorcycle operator's license, or identification card until the registrar of motor vehicles implements the provisions of rules 4501:1-1-41, 4501:1-1-42, 4501:1-1-43, and 4501:1-1-44 of the Administrative Code on or after January 1, 2013. This rule continues the current lists to prove an applicant's full legal name, date of birth, social security number, legal presence in the United States, and Ohio home street address.
