The fee for the required background check varies from thirty five dollars (\$35.00) to forty five dollars (\$45.00). The salesperson application fee is ten dollars (\$10.00), and a motor vehicle dealer application fee starts at two hundred and fifty four dollars and seventy five cents (\$254.75). Prices will vary if the applicant requests additional plates.
