4501:1-3-07 (Law enforcement report required with application) establishes that an owner, officer of a corporation, or trustee of a business applying for a dealer's license shall furnish a complete report from local law enforcement agencies checked on a state-wide basis through the bureau of criminal investigations. This rule was rewritten to improve organization and clarity, as well as to properly address materials (agency applications) incorporated by reference.

The salesperson application fee is ten dollars (\$10.00), the motor vehicle dealer application fee is two hundred and fifty-four dollars and seventy-five cents (\$254.75), and the salvage motor vehicle dealer application fee is one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Prices will vary if the applicant requests special/additional dealer
