This proposed rule change is based on procedural changes undertaken by the U.S. military. Previously an applicant's United States armed forces identification card included an indication as to whether a person was considerd to be on active duty status. The United States armed forces identification cards are no longer required to indicate this information and therefore reference to them as a form of documentation of active duty status recognized by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles for the purpose of obtaining special license plates is being proposed for removal

from the rule.

This rule sets forth the written evidence required of applicants for reservist and veteran special license plates and provides definitions. HB 406 (125th GA) had also allowed that active duty personnel in any branch of the armed forces of the United States could obtain special plates and this is reflected in the rule. For purposes of proving active duty military status to obtain an active duty license plate, because the United States armed forces identification cards are no longer required to indicate this status, the proposed rule amendment to paragraph (M) eliminates United States armed forces identification cards as a form of Bureau of Motor of Vehicles recognized proof.
