The rule writing authority and amplification codes have been updated due to various sections of codes being repealed. The entirety of the rule has been amended to align with legislative language changes set forth by 4501.01 of the R.C. as amended by HB 74 of the 134th General Assembly, effective June 30, 2021.

Paragraph B, subsection 3 has been updated to add a comment incorporating "Application for Disabled Veterans, Former Prisoners of War & Spouses of Deceased Former Prisoners" (BMV Form 4507), and the update the form names of "Request for Specialty License Plates" (BMV Form 4705) and "Application for Registration by Mail" (BMV Form 4625).
