This rule is being filed according to a R.C. 119.032 review of Chapter 4501:2-10 of the Administrative Code. This rule is simultaneously being proposed for rescission due to the fifty percent guideline. It is estimated that changes to the rule strike approximately half of the existing text while adding a comparable amount of new text.

This rule establishes the required points of contact for agencies participating in LEADS and sets forth the expectations for said contacts. Changes in this new rule from its previous version include: 1) changed rule title to "LEADS points of contact;" 2) reworded section headers and corrected subsection lettering/alignment; 3) added section for FBI CJIS required local agency security officer (LASO) at each LEADS terminal agency and duties/requirements; and 4) moved language from paragraph (K) of rule 4501:2-10-06 to paragraphs (A)(1)(h) and (B)(1)(f) of this rule.
