This filing is based on a R.C. 119.032, five-year review of Rule 4501:3-1-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code. To update the existing rule and improve Department rule organization, this new amended version of the rule is being proposed for adoption and simultaneously the existing rule (similar title and number) is being proposed for rescission.

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This rule entitled "Public notice" sets forth the procedure for the Ohio emergency management agency to give pubic notice of, and the agenda of meetings when required by section 121.22 of the Revised Code. The proposed new version of the rule removes existing rule provisions regarding public notice of hearings on rulemaking because concurrent with this filing, the Department is proposing relocation of a rule (on this topic) to a location more readily apparent as applicable to all divisions of the Department of Public Safety. That new rule (4501-3-01) provides requirements for notice of public hearings regarding the proposed adoption, amendment or rescission of an administrative rule, making part of existing rule 4501:3-1-01 unnecessary. Ohio EMA will retain the notice of public meetings portion of this rule.
