The imposition of a fine for a second or subsequent offense for violation of sections 4717.01 to 4717.15 of Chapter 4717. of the Ohio Revised Code or a rule adopted under any of those sections is uncommon.

The estimated decrease of six thousand seven hundred fifty dollars in the agency's revenue is the difference between the current minimum fine amount (\$7,500) and the proposed lowest minimum fine amount (\$750) for a second or subsequent offense.
