The rule requires an individual to be licensed as a funeral director or embalmer to register to complete the course.

B. Does this rule impose a criminal penalty, a civil penalty, or another sanction, or create a cause of action, for failure to comply with its terms? Yes

While the rule does not specifically impose a penalty, a funeral director or embalmer who trains an apprentice without completing the master's program is subject to disciplinary action. Such act would constitute unprofessional conduct under the Administrative Code.

C. Does this rule require specific expenditures or the report of information as a condition of compliance? Yes

While the rule does not explicitly create an expenditure, the rule requires the licensee the pay the program fee set by the program provider obtain the master's certification.

D. Is it likely that the rule will directly reduce the revenue or increase the expenses of the lines of business of which it will apply or applies? Yes

The program fees associated to secure and maintain the master's certification could reduce revenue or increase expenses for a funeral home.
