This rule sets forth the criteria and standards to be used by a licensed nurse when delegating nursing tasks to unlicensed persons. In several provisions within this

rule the phrase "trained unlicensed person" is changed to "unlicensed person" consistent with the change in rule 4723-13-01 where the two definitions are combined into one.

In paragraph (C), new language is added to clarify that a licensed nurse may delegate to unlicensed persons the administration of medications in two categories only: over-the-counter topical medications to be applied to intact skin; and over-the-counter eye drops, ear drops, and suppositories.

In paragraph (F) language is revised to clarify that the delegating nurse is accountable for the decision to delegate to an unlicensed person. This language works in conjunction with the new definition of "delegating nurse" in rule 4723-13-01, and reflects the fact that a new nurse assuming responsibility for a patient for whom a delegated nursing task is provided, is accountable for his/her decision to continue or discontinue the delegation. In paragraph (G), the language clearly requires that any licensed nurse who determines that a delegated nursing task is not being performed correctly is obligated to intervene.
