The rule proposed under this statutory authority is necessary to facilitate compliance with the provisions in Chapters 4729 of the Ohio Revised Code to promote the public's safety and uniformity of care throughout Ohio. Without these regulations, the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy would not be able to:

-Provide uniform standards for the administration of immunizations by pharmacists and pharmacy interns; and

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-Ensure that pharmacists/pharmacy interns are able to provide the most up-to-date CDC ACIP recommended immunizations.

Rule addresses recent changes to the requirements of section 4729.41 of the Ohio Revised Code by: 1) specifying the types of immunizations that a pharmacist or pharmacy intern can administer; 2) outlines informed consent requirements; and 3) ensures compliance with federal law.
