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rule 4731-11-09 which implements these prescribing changes is replacing the current rule.

The rule is being rescinded. The rule requires that a physician shall not prescribe controlled drugs or non-controlled drugs to a person on whom the physician has never conducted a physical examination. Also, the rule details exceptions to this requirement. In addition, the rule provides for telemedicine prescribing of non-controlled drugs if the prescriber follows the standard of care requirements listed in the rule.
