The Board strongly believes that the Core of Knowledge course is an integral part of the licensure process and needs to be regulated in order to produce consistent outcomes and success on the examinations and as future licensees.

7. Summarize the rule's content, and if this is an amended rule, also summarize the rule's changes.

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This rule lists the requirements for the Core of Knowledge course (other than subject material).

The Board proposes to amend this rule to require applicants to be providers of the Core of Knowledge course to successfully complete the approval approval process required for applicants to be providers of continuing education under rules 4751-1-08 and 4751-1-08.1 of the Administrative Code.

The Board proposes to move the twenty-credit-hour limit on distance learning or home study from paragraph (D) to (A) and to add a mechanism for allowing more hours of distance learning during the COVID pandemic.

The Board proposes to move paragraphs (A)(1) to (A)(3) to (C)(3) to (C)(5).

The Board also proposes to remove from this rule the following as requirements for its approval of providers of the Core of Knowledge course: (1) demonstrated ability to successfully put on a course of similar size and scope, (2) resources and benefits provided to students (e.g., books, study guides), and (3) the collection of feedback from students.
