7. What are the reasons for proposing the rule?

This rule exists to establish the standards for a health services executive (HSE) license.

8. Summarize the rule's content, and if this is an amended rule, also summarize the rule's changes.

This rule establishes the standards for an HSE license.

The Board proposes to amend this rule to achieve the following:

1. Reflect H.B. 509's amendments to R.C. Chapter 4751, which replaced annual renewal of license (registration) with biennial renewal and doubled the renewal fee.
2. Replace the requirement for 4 hours of additional annual continuing education for HSEs in paragraph (F) of this rule with a requirement for 8 additional hours of additional biennial continuing education for HSEs. This is in response to H.B. 509's amendments noted in #1.
3. Delete references to online learning in paragraph (F) of this rule.
4. Insert a new paragraph (J) of this rule before the existing paragraph (J) of this rule to establish that the Board will consider an HSE to have abandoned the practice if the HSE does not renew the HSE license within a year after the license's expiration date. Such a person would need to reapply for an HSE license if the person wanted to return to licensure.

Amending this rule will not impact the biennial budget that the Ohio General Assembly established for the Board. As noted in the fiscal analysis for H.B. 509 (134th G.A.), the license renewal will be biennial rather than annual, but the renewal fee will double at the same time.

This rule requires HSEs to pay a fee for their licenses and renewal of licenses (registration), plus an additional fee for untimely renewal, and establishes continuing education requirements for HSEs.

The fees in this rule go to the BELTSS Fund under R.C. §4751.03 and relate to the cost to administer the Board's duties under R.C. Chapter 4751 and Chapter 4751-1 of the Administrative Code.

The rule establishes that a HSE licensee who abandons (does not renew a year after expiration) a license loses the license. The rule also establishes late fees for late license renewals.
