In order to provide speech-language pathology or audiology services via telehealth, the provider must be licensed as a speech-language pathologist or audiologist.

B. Does this rule impose a criminal penalty, a civil penalty, or another sanction, or create a cause of action, for failure to comply with its terms? Yes

Providing telehealth services without a license constitutes practice without a license, which is a violation of Ohio Revised Code section 4753.02. Providing telehealth services in violation of the provisions can subject the licensee to disciplinary action by the board.
