The Board is going through an overhaul of its rules. Because the board is structured in four separate sections for governance purposes (OT, PT, AT, OPP), over time duplicative rules were developed. Most of these rules are nearly identical in order to promote

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uniform processes for efficiency purposes. The Board has decided to combine these rules which are often repeated four times. This will result in a very large reduction in rules, going from 169 total rules to 86. Some of these rules are also up for five-year rule review and are being rescinded and renumbered as a result.
